**MINUTES OF 9<sup>TH</sup> MIDH MEETING HELD ON DATED 04.02.2016 AT 11:00 AM AT UDHYAN BHAWAN, PANCHKULA UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF SH. BIKRAM SINGH YADAV, HON'BLE MINISTER OF STATE (AGRICULTURE).**

Sh. Bikram Singh Yadav, Hon'ble Minister of State (Agriculture) chaired the 9<sup>th</sup> meeting of MIDH. The welcome of Chief Guest was done by Dr. B.S. Sehrawat, Mission Director, Haryana State Horticulture Development Agency (HSHDA). The introduction of all the officers present from HQ and districts was conducted with brief description about their district/job. Thereafter, a comprehensive presentation was made by Dr. Arjun Singh Saini, Director General Horticulture, about the efforts of Department in implementation of Govt. schemes for the welfare of farmers of Haryana State. The present status and future strategies for the Development of Horticulture was explained. The statistical data regarding Horticulture area, its contribution in State GDP, crop wise area production and productivity and on other facets of Horticulture field was presented.

Dr. C.J Juneja, Senior Consultant (Bee-Keeping), Integrated Bee Keeping Development Centre (IBDC), Ram Nagar (Kurukshetra) made a power point presentation focusing on the various activities being conducted under this Indo-Israel Project at IBDC. The various products and by products of Bees, extractions techniques, its use, marketing were explained to the house.

Hon'ble Chairman praised the achievements made by the Department/HSHDA. He directed that the farmer particularly small and marginal farmers who are sitting in remote villages could not fetch the benefits of the schemes run by the State and Centre Govt. because of the lack of awareness. The various components under Horticulture are beneficial to small and marginal farmers; by adoption of such components the status of small farmers can be raised. The youth of village can be involved in Horticulture activities after their skill development. Govt. has also initiated many schemes for skill development. The officers should reach to the villages and aware the poor farmers to achieve the overall goals set by the Government.



Thereafter, Dr. B.S. Sehrawat, MD given detailed presentation about MIDH scheme, its objectives, budget allotted, budget utilized, component wise scenario and implementation of scheme in the state. The agenda wise review was taken.

**During review of component wise progress the following decisions were taken by house.**

3.1 MD instructed to MS DHMIUs that the targets under Bee Keeping Component will be achieved only for SCSP category farmers. The Training Certificate is mandatory under this component. The priority shall be given to release assistance in the bank account of beneficiaries through RTGS. If any farmer is unable to avail assistance directly, then an undertaking of beneficiary may be considered to release the assistance amount to the empaneled firms.

3.2 MD informed the house that under HRD component the seminar, conference, workshop etc. should be completed within this month. These should be conducted in the villages adopted under Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojna (SAGY) as per instructions given by GOI.

3.3 Promotion of Post-Harvest Management Component: MD informed the house that we should take at least 10-15% targets of our total action plan under this component in order to strengthen the cool chain facilities. In districts nearby Delhi like Sonapat such facilities are available on large scale and the



intervention of Department is not much required. In other districts where these facilities are available in scarce should be promoted.

**b) Status of Funds released by HSHDA to DHMIUs under MIDH for 2015-16.**

As desired the information in requisite performa could not be received well in time. MD, instructed to submit the reports, information at least two days before the meeting. The monthly reports should be uploaded on website ([www.nhm.nic.in](http://www.nhm.nic.in)) on or before 3<sup>rd</sup> of every month by district offices. The overall monthly progress of state should be uploaded on or before 5<sup>th</sup> of every month by state office.
